Mending democracy, practicing resilience

Description: Although there are many challenges ahead as we seek to navigate the tensions and synergies between democracy and environmentalism on local, national, and global levels, with a growing skepticism that democracy, with its slow and cumbersome process, can handle the scale and severity of the global environmental crisis, there are also glimmers of hope. In this last seminar of the semester, we end on a positive note by looking at Carolyn Hendrik et al.'s study of the largely hidden democratic repair work already undertaken by citizens, politicians, and public managers in their everyday lives, using resources at their disposal to mend dysfunctional democratic disconnects in constituent-representative relationships, fractured public spheres, and tangled policy processes.
